NSGC Membership

- As of December 21, 2014, NSGC had 3,159 members. Dues renewal is underway for 2015.

Board of Directors

- The NSGC Board of Directors meets monthly by phone and met in-person September 16, 2014 in New Orleans, LA.
- The next in-person Board meeting is scheduled for January 23-24, 2015 in Chicago, IL.

Education

- NSGC is approved as a provider of CEUs for genetic counselors. Please contact [Kate Maude](#), NSGC Continuing Education Coordinator, with any questions.
- The 2015 Annual Education Conference (AEC) is scheduled for October 21-24, 2015 in Pittsburgh, PA. Program development is currently underway. Conference information is available on the [NSGC website](#) and the preliminary program will be released in late May.
- A successful 2014 Annual Education Conference (AEC) was held September 17-20 in New Orleans, LA.
- NSGC has many online educational opportunities available for additional continuing education. These cover a variety of topics such as family history, coding and billing and cultural competency. Additional information on these and other course is available to the public on the [NSGC website](#).
- Recent courses of interest include:
 - NSGC launched the online course, [Incorporating Technology into Genetic Counseling Practice](#), in June 2014. This course is focused on professional development for genetic counselors and genetics professionals.
 - In early 2014 NSGC launched the educational series, [Business Foundations for Genetic Counselors](#). This series currently includes two courses, [Insurance and Credentialing 101](#) and [Billing and Coding](#). Each course includes an online didactic module, ongoing webinars, resource materials and a course participant discussion

 - Passed bills/in rulemaking: HI, NH, ND, VA
 - Bill introduced or preparing to introduce bills: CO, CT, FL, ID, KS, MD, MI, MN, MS, NY, OR, RI, TX, WI
