Ideal FHx Tool

- **Minimum effort, maximum utility**
- In-line with usual workflow
 - Native to EHR or seamlessly integrated
 - User-defined display (text vs. graphical)
- Limited provider action required
 - Data entry by patient/family
 - Corroborated/accepted by provider
- Robust clinical decision support (CDS)
 - Advice at point of care when appropriate
 - Requires discrete data readily available to EHR

3rd Party Software

Pros (among others):

- ↑ Data entry by patient/family
- ↑ Corroborated/accepted by provider
- ↑ Graphical display

Cons (among others):

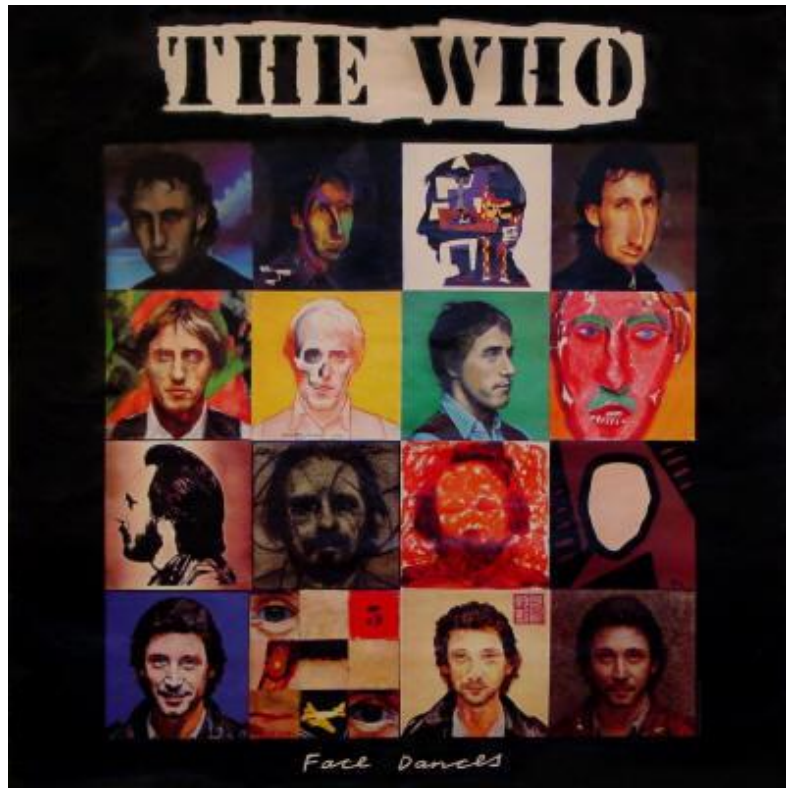
- ↓ Purchase costs
- ↓ Interface costs
- ↓ **Interface maintenance (both systems)**

EHR Software

Pros:

- ↑ Native to EHR
- ↑ (Limited) Data entry by patient/family
- ↑ Corroborated/accepted by provider
- ↑ (Limited) Discrete data
- ↑ Built-in CDS

Cons:

- ↓ No graphical display
- ↓ Insufficient discrete data

EHR Software

- Polite persistence, with help from CMIO
- Multiple customers with similar requests
- Collaborative work with vendor to improve functionality
- Rewarding process, collegial collaboration, exciting enhancements in development

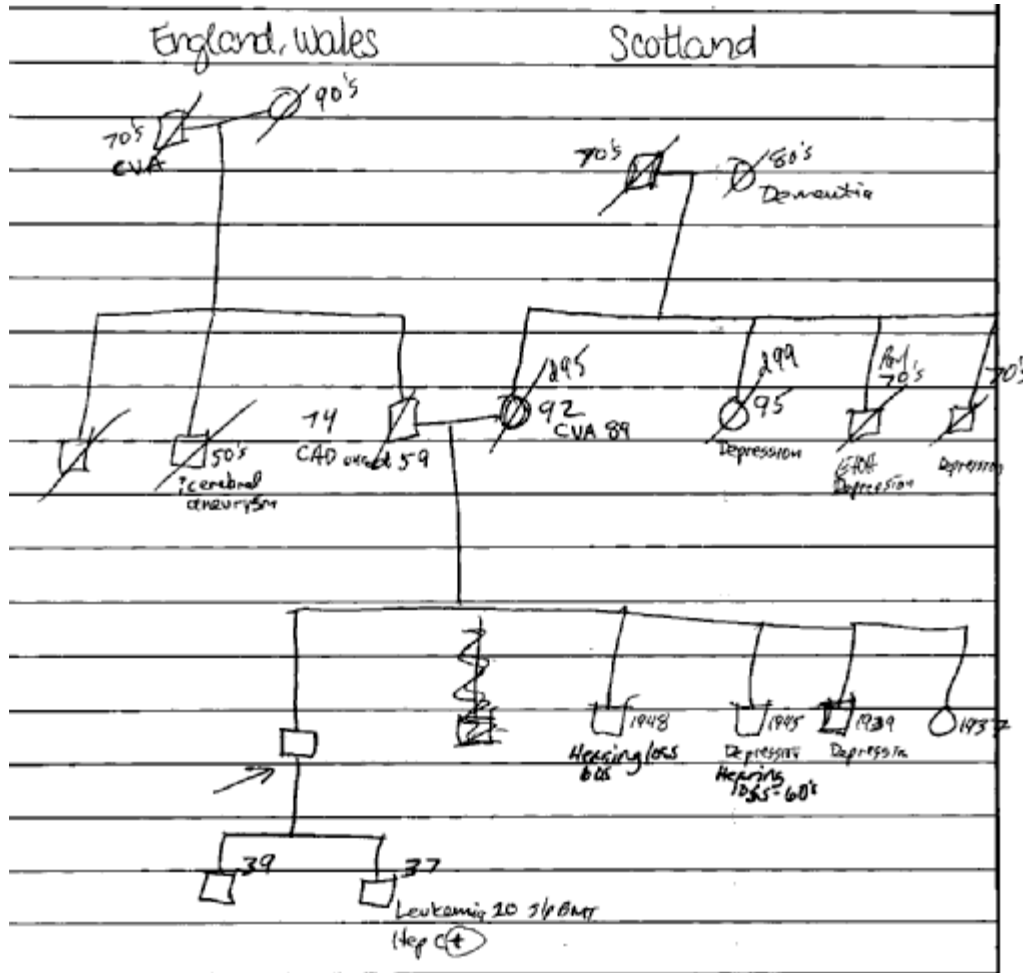

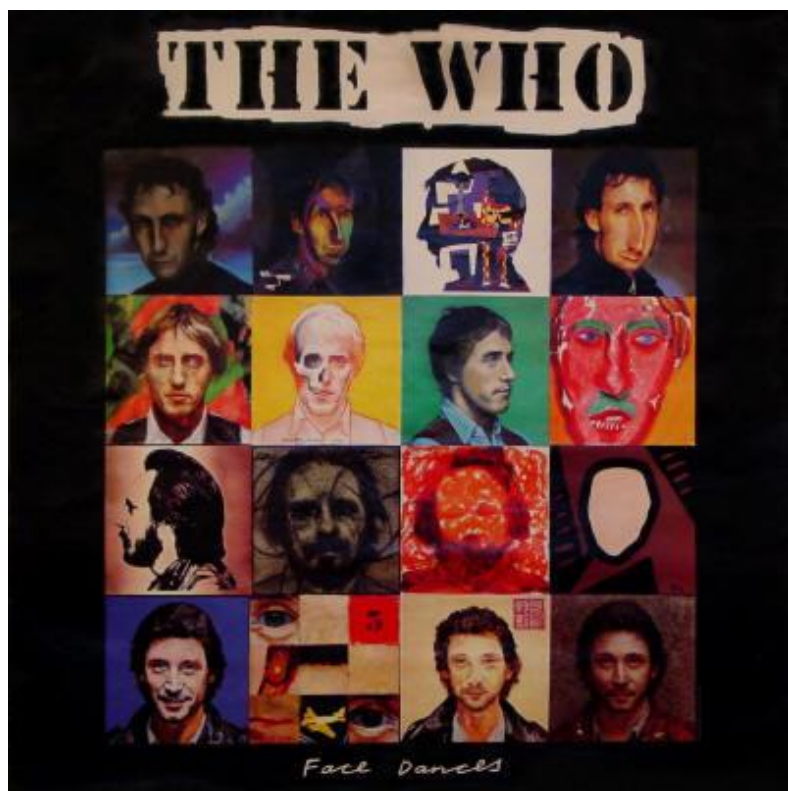
