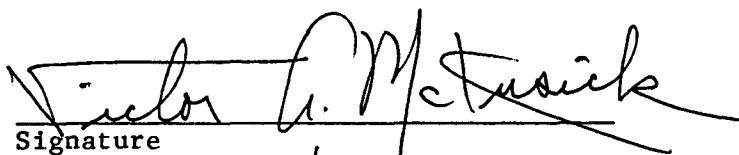

Dear Dr. McKusick:

I am pleased that you have accepted the Secretary's invitation to serve as a member of the Program Advisory Committee on the Human Genome, for the term beginning October 30, 1988 and ending September 30, 1991.

The Program Advisory Committee on the Human Genome, NIH, was established by the Secretary, Department of Health and Human Services on July 21, 1988. The purpose of the committee, as defined in its charter, is to advise the Secretary; the Assistant Secretary for Health; the Director, National Institutes of Health; and the Associate Director for Human Genome Research, National Institutes of Health, on all aspects of research in the area of genomic analysis.

The Committee will identify opportunities to advance the ability of scientists to analyze the composition and organization of the genetic material of a number of organisms, with the goal of applying this information to the analysis of the human genome. Specifically, the Committee shall identify opportunities, including areas of research requiring additional effort, and recommend initiatives to further research on the methodology of genomic analysis, on the characterization of the genomes of a variety of organisms, and information and database technology. The Committee will also address the resource and training needs of the research community, as they pertain to genomic analysis. Finally, the Committee will suggest conferences, workshops, or other activities that the NIH should support to further the development of this research area.

Meetings of the Committee will be held at least twice a year, for one or more days, usually at the National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, Maryland. Committee members are compensated at the rate of \$150 per day for time spent at meetings. In addition, members are allowed travel expenses and per diem. Per diem reimbursement is determined by the location at which

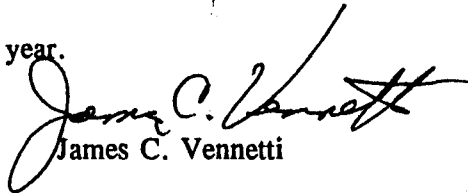

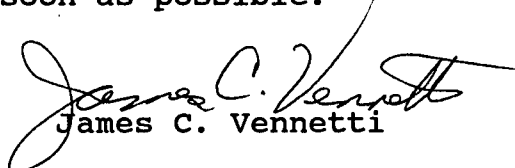

The purpose of this memorandum is to ask for an exemption to Instruction and Information Memorandum 89-04, Per Diem at the Official Duty Station - Civilian Employees.

Dr. Victor McKusick, Professor of Medical Genetics at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland, is currently a member of the Program Advisory Committee on the Human Genome. Dr. McKusick's appointment to the Committee began October 30, 1988 and expires September 30, 1991. As a member of this Program Advisory Committee, Dr. McKusick will attend a variety of meetings at the NIH related to the Human Genome Program. Meetings of the Program Advisory Committee on the Human Genome will be held at least twice a year, for one or more days, usually at the NIH.

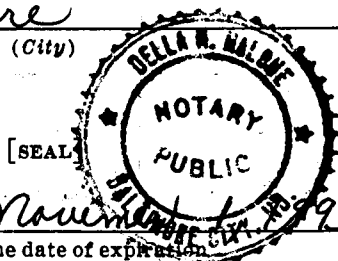

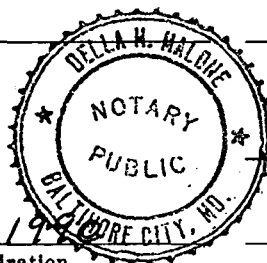
